## The Chesapeake Semester at Washington College

The competitive program will accept 8-10 Washington College students for the fall semester of 2014. The program runs from August 16<sup>th</sup> to December 17<sup>th</sup>, 2014. If selected, interviews will be conducted March 19<sup>th</sup> through the 21st, and students will be notified of their acceptance March 24<sup>th</sup>. A \$5,500 program fee is required on top of standard enrollment fees. This fee covers all field trip expenses, including airfare and travel abroad. To the Academic Advisor and Faculty Reference: The student listed above is applying for an immersion program in Chesapeake Regional Studies. This is a four-course program for 16 credits that is offered only in the fall. The program is open to rising sophomores, juniors and seniors. We encourage applications from students of all majors possessing the enthusiasm and energy required to excel in a rigorous academic environment. We are especially interested in the following: 1) academic ability, 2) creativity, 3) curiosity, 4) flexibility, 5) teamwork, 6) interest in ecology and culture.

If selected, the applicant will join a team of 8-10 students to study the complex history, ecology, and culture of North America's largest estuary as a microcosm of the challenges and transitions confronting coastal communities around the world. The Chesapeake Semester combines intensive study, field-work, and outdoor adventure with group and individual leadership skills. Campus based class- work will be supplemented with four, 9-10 day, themed overnight journeys. The final journeywill take students on a comparative study abroad to explore similarities and differences in culture, economics, politics, laws, ethics, and resource management.

The Chesapeake Semester requires a \$5,500 program fee on top of standard enrollment fees. A non-refundable \$500 program deposit is required by April 30th, 2014.
