participate?

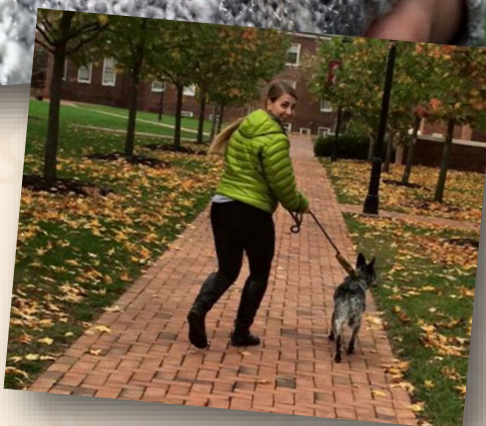
Evans: If students have their own cars they can go to shelter by themselves. If they don't, we organize shelter trips using a college van.

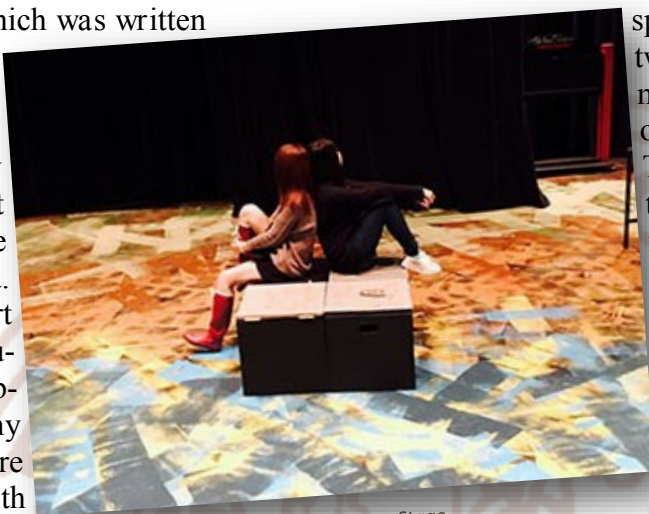
My First Scene

The Cost of Studying Abroad

The cost of studying abroad is expensive, especially for those students who travel from developing countries to the developed countries. In addition to the high tuition fees, there are many other expenses, such as food, clothes, and entertainment. A Chinese student studying in the United States may have to spend more than fifty thousand dollars in one semester. So this article will talk about where is the money spent.

The first part of spending money is food. The international student usually cannot be good to adapt to local food because they are not local people. So Chinese students will choose to eat in *China House*, which is a Chinese restaurant, on the weekend, therefore they can improve the diet, and not adapt. Usually three to

four students eat each meal together, with each one spending on average \$20 to \$30. Two times a week, eight times a month, so students spend at least \$160 dollars extra for food in one month. In addition to *China House* restaurant, students will also buy some snacks and drinks in Acme, one of the local grocery stores. They will spend about \$25 once time a week on snacks and drinks. Then added together, students spend at least \$260 per month and \$780 in one semester.

The second part of spending money is clothing. Because the weight of carrying personal items on planes is limited, it is impossible to carry all the clothes to go abroad, so they need to buy clothes to adapt to

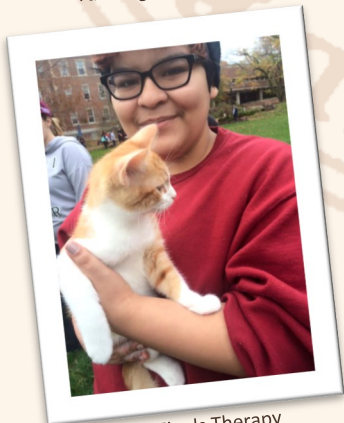

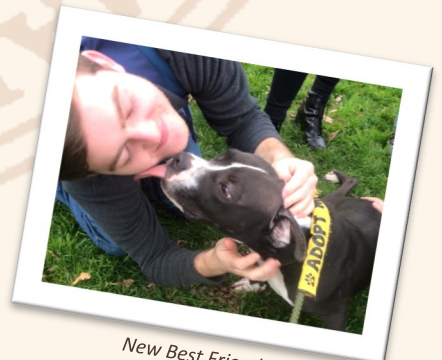

local weather changes.

Also in many countries, there is no Thanksgiving Day, so that means there is no Black Friday, a famous shopping day in the United States. Prices after discounts are very attractive, so many students will choose to buy clothes on Black Friday. They will cost about \$1000 to \$2000 for each student.

The third part of spending money is entertainment. Most of the students will choose to play computer games to relax themselves, especially Chinese students. Therefore, they need a computer to play video games; this kind of computer costs about \$1000 to \$1500. There are also breaks during a semester and some students will choose to travel. They will need to pay fares, accommodations, and travel expenses. This will cost \$400 to \$500 for one trip; students will spend about \$1000 for one semester.

In general, an international student needs to spend \$4000 to \$5000 in one semester. This money can be divided into food, clothing, entertainment, and travel fees.
